# 1 HEALTHY PERSON VITALS

These are the most useful notes from med school:

Resting heart rate: 80

Normal skin color: white

Normally all the blood is contained in a person's body.

Normally there is no pain anywhere.

## 2 BLOOD SPURTS

It can happen in so many areas. If blood is spurting from the:

### HEAD:

If blood pours from the head, and another area, apply ointment to the groin. Are you sure your patient didn't ask for this?

If blood spurts from the head, and the skin is a green color, go to section 5. You don't want to be around any longer than you have to.

If blood is gushing from the head, then use the tourniquet on leg. Don't ask why. Just do it.

### GROIN:

If blood spurts from the groin, and another area, then apply the ointment on groin. Why do so many things result in ointment on the groin? I'm a doctor so who cares just hurry up and do it before your patient dies.

If blood spurts from the groin, and the skin is off-white, administer the pill. That color surely isn't natural.

If blood spurts from the groin, then use the tourniquet on the arm. Your patient will seem disappointed but at the same time better feel better after this.

### ARM:

If blood spurts from the arm, and another area, then apply the ointment on groin. It really helps.

If blood spurts from the arm, and the skin is not a natural color, administer the pill. It cures skin colors. Really.


If blood spurts from the arm, then use the tourniquet on the groin. You manage to get it on somehow.

### LEG:

If blood spurts from the leg, and another area, then apply ointment onto the groin. The patient gives a deep sigh of relief.

If blood spurts from the leg, and the skin is a red color, then go to section 5. Whatever you do, do not apply a tourniquet to the leg. It will make things worse.

If blood spurts from the leg, use the tourniquet on head. The patient is feeling better already.



## 3 PAIN

In the case that aspirin doesn't solve this. If the pain is in the...

### HEAD:

Administer the pill and go to section 5.

### GROIN:

Apply ointment to the leg. If heartbeat is above 80, go to section 4. Otherwise administer a pill.

### ARM:

Apply ointment to the arm. If heartbeat is below 80, go to section 5. Otherwise go to section 4.

LEG:

Apply ointment to the head.

## 4 HEARTBEAT

You should strive to keep this above 0.

If heartbeat is above 80, inject the arm with the mystery shot. Otherwise go to section 3.

## 5 SKIN COLOR

Who knew skin could turn into these colors!

If the skin is:	Then	And
Green	Administer a pill in the groin area	Apply an ointment on the leg
Red	Apply a tourniquet to the head	Inject the head with a shot
Blue	Apply a tourniquet to the head	Inject the groin with a shot
White	Apply an ointment on the leg	Why did you do that to normal skin? Better safe than sorry!
